

The St. Joe County Conservation District is conducting a river cleanup project starting this year! The first phase involves trimming downed trees that otherwise make our rivers impassible to kayaks, canoes, fishermen, etc. The second phase involves cleaning up the garbage that has accumulated in and along the banks of our rivers. Starting this August, volunteers will make their way down the rivers, collecting any garbage that has accumulated. The final phase involves raising enough money to install four handicapped accessible kayak/canoe ramps by 2014.
